FROM PASTOR JONATHAN

Psalm 46 ¹God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. ² Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, mountains quake with their surging... ¹⁰ He says, "Be still, and know that I am God... ¹¹The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

This month I want to share with you how important it is for us to "be stilled." Several weeks ago, I found myself stressing out over various church, family, and health obligations. I was worried that as those obligations increased, I would find myself falling behind and never catching up.

While the stress was getting to me, I ended up in the best place to find a solution: Sunday worship. As Connie and Dick were playing a wonderful duet during the 9 am Prelude, I was reminded of my favorite line from Psalm 46: "Be still, and know that I am God." So I took God's advice and "be stilled" while I listened to the music. For the first time in weeks, I was in the moment. I did not think about the future or the past. God helped me stay focused on the present, and with that my stress disappeared. STEPHEN MINISTRY

It does take a village; however, the chieftain of the village is Jesus Christ. A very wise man developed a program called Stephen Ministry. This ministry is based on allowing trained Care Givers to help Care Receivers bear their burdens with the assistance of Jesus Christ, the greatest care giver. This is created through one on one contact, prayer, listening, empathy and asking God to hear these requests.

Today's news produces fear and anxiety in our homes and communities. Losing a job or foreclosure on a home mortgage are real happenings. Stephen Ministers are a part of our church family who are able to listen and feel compassion for hurting situations.

Members of our society are living longer and maybe losing a lifelong mate at an older age. The loneliness and sadness is real...these are human conditions that need attention. Older

parents become ill and unable to stay in their homes. There is guilt from children who live far away and cannot take care of the people who cared for them and who helped make them the people that they have become.

There will always be hurt, injustice, death, illness, poverty; however, a Stephen Minister is a person who can walk with a hurting person. He/she will pray with and for their Care Receiver. The role of the Stephen Minister is not to solve the problem but to inspire, to instill confidence and self worth so that the care receiver can develop skills that will direct them through this difficult time in their lives. Stephen Ministry is a loving, empathic ministry that is conducted with the strictest of confidence.

Several years ago, one of us sought the help of a Christian Minister. She was a high school counselor during this time of her life. Many times she told her counselees that she was also seeking guidance from a counselor and it seemed to make it okay that they were sharing extremely confidential information. During this time, she truly learned that everyone benefits from sharing feelings of fear and stressful situations that may be happening in their lives. She learned....No one is free of problems... some may be different from others but we all have them.

A Stephen Minister is not a counselor but serves in a similar capacity with the emphasis that the Stephen Minister is the Care Giver and that our loving God is the Cure Giver.

If perhaps, you read this article and you believe that talking to a loving, caring person could help you bear your burdens then call Pastor Mark, Linda Evans, or Martha Greer at our church and simply make a request to be assigned a Stephen Minister.

YOUTH MISSION TRIP TO THE FL PANHANDLE

On July 22nd, Patsy Perhala, Jim Bauer, Susan Jackson, Meghan Stello, Anna Phelps, Anna Haskins, Delilah Mills, Sam Beasley, Kendall Bauer, Richard Walters, and Adam Russell headed to St. George Island, FL to participate in Hurricane Michael Relief.

At arrival, we were greeted by counselors from Camp Luther Springs (located in Hawthorne, GA, one of our 4 Novus Way camp sites), who would be guided us in our bible studies, evening activities, and processing through-out the week.

Monday morning, we headed to work our work destination: Lynn Haven, Florida, Lynn Haven, a suburb of Panama City, was devastated by winds and driving rain from Hurricane Michael. We worked through Lutheran Disaster Response, Hope Panhandle, and SBP (St. Bernard Project, established after Hurricane Katrina). The main goal of these organizations is to help displaced families return home through rebuilding. The biggest challenge of rebuilding is money. The community consists mostly of homeowners who rent out their homes (over 60% of the community rents). These owners do not have the adequate insurance needed to cover the damages they face-mostly wind damage from 135 mph winds. Thus, widespread displacement has occurred, forcing many to leave or live in campers and tents. Hurricane Michael was upgraded to a category 5 in the late spring, after accessing the damage and strength. Our week ended with a trip to Panama City Beach, to snorkel and see the ocean wildlife. We finished our week with worship and headed home Friday mid-morning, arriving back in Wilmington on Saturday.

KAIROS CONFIRMATION CAMP

Susan Jackson and Daisy Gaither spent a week at Lutheridge (located in Arden, NC) participating in the Kairos Confirmation Program. Kairos simply means: In God's time. This summer, we focused on finding Jesus through Holy Week. Each day of the Camp week has a theme, a curriculum to support the theme, music, activities, and either evening vespers with cabins/areas or worship together. This year, our themes were: Palm Sunday (following Jesus into Jerusalem), Who is Jesus (our own identity and how we know who Jesus is), How do we live our lives following Jesus (focusing on Maundy Thursday), Why do Bad Things Happen (focusing on Good Friday), Where is God (Focusing on Holy Saturday), and When is Easter (Now! Here! Everywhere!). even experienced a mini Easter Vigil, something most of our teens have not had the opportunity to do before! Students also had the daily opportunity to ask hard questions about their faith and social issues, answered by Pastors, Deacons, Church leaders, and Camp staff. It was amazing to here what these middle school students think and worry about!

Mornings are spent focusing on the curriculum in large group, small group, music, and congregation time. Afternoons are spent with campers cabins and areas in crafts, games, and other activities. Evenings are spent at campfire, devotions, vespers (evening prayer), and worship. Each week also includes an outing. This year we went to Kuhkendal State Park for a creek walk and games.

When asked about her week, Daisy said "I liked camp very much. I made new friends and loved Kairos time. I liked the trip to the lake a lot". Daisy also talked about how she liked learning about God in a different type of setting than she has been in before.
